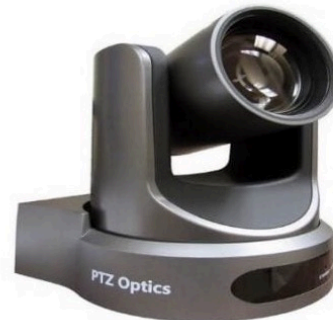

Skype

- August 2003: first release
- September 2005: acquired by eBay for \$2.6 billion
- May 2011: acquired by Microsoft
 - 100 million users
- 2014: Oxford English Dictionary
- 2015: 300 million users
- July 2016: alpha client for Linux

Skype

- Initially not well-suited to mobile devices
- Reliability issues
- Usability issues
 - Frequent redesigns
- Account required

Zoom

- April 2011: founded by Eric Yuan, former VP at Cisco Webex, + 40 engineers
- January 2013: first release
- April 2019: IPO
- October 2020: market cap \$140 billion
 - More than ExxonMobil
